SIRS Enduring Issues volume titles include:

- **Business**—considers the effects of the growing global economy on business, industry, government, and individuals. Subtopics include Economics, Money, Work, and Consumerism
- **Global Issues**—provides articles that reinterpret the past and provide insights for today. Subtopics include History, Government, World Affairs, and Third World
- **Human Relations**—focuses on the social issues that contribute to the responsible shaping of society. Subtopics include Ethics, Ethnic Groups, Human Rights, and Sexuality
- **Environment**—examines the complicated and somewhat tenuous relationship between people and their habitat. Subtopics include Population, Habitat, Pollution, and Energy

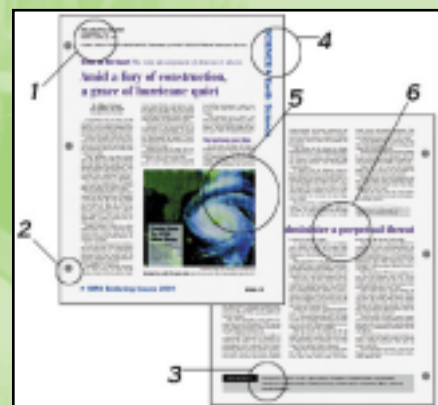
